Revd Dr Andy Lyons Message:

Dear Lambeth Circuit Members,

On Sunday June 16th we held the farewell service for the Revd. Andy Dart as he left the circuit to move into retirement. It was a wonderful occasion and Revd. Andy has written a letter of appreciation which you will find in this magazine.

On Saturday 7th September we will welcome Rev Sue Shortman, who comes to us from the Birmingham Circuit, at a service to be held at Clapham High Street at 5pm. In this service I will also be 'welcomed' as the Circuit Superintendent, although as you all know I have been doing the role for the last 15 months. Thankfully with the arrival of Sue I will not have to be doing two jobs! Sue will have pastoral charge of Lambeth Walk (please note the change of name) and Streatham and will be exploring what mission possibilities there might be at a site in Vauxhall that is soon to be opened.

I will also have moved house as I go to Rev Andy Dart's old manse in Mitcham Lane and Sue will move into Wincott Street. Moving is always a stressful time – and in Methodism where ministers all move in August – it has to be very quick. Thankfully this time we have found two good contractors to do the refurbishments.

In November I will reach my 66th Birthday – so I should have retired this year – but will stay on for a while (still to be determined) – as there is still work to be done to fulfil the merger of the two circuits and to fulfil all our obligations to the Charity Commission and to The Methodist Church Constitution. Whilst this work is rather tedious, we do need to improve our governance and administration so that hopefully we can then focus more on our outreach and ministry work.

My best news to share with you, who have not already heard, is that I have got engaged to the wonderful and beautiful Antonia Buamah. I did not really expect to find love at my age – but as we say God is Good. And full of surprises.

Our Autumn term in the life of the church is always busy with meetings, Harvest and other special Sundays. Please keep all the ministers and preachers and officers of the circuit and churches in your prayers as we continue on our journey of faith together.

I am disappointed to let you know that the new church at Lambeth Mission – to be called Lambeth Walk – is still not finished and open. I have pencilled in a circuit service to be held there at the end of November as it should be open by then – but we have been delayed so many times I won't actually believe it until the keys are handed over to us by the developer.

Revd Lena's Message

Isaiah said, "the Lord is a God of justice" (30:18) and as Christians, we believe that this divine justice is the theological position of God's judgment on us. Zechariah 7:9 reminds us: "This is what the Lord Almighty says: 'Administer true justice; show mercy and compassion to one another.'" Many people think of justice in terms of criminal justice, of punishing criminals which is retributive justice. Another form of justice is procedural justice which requires that there is no bias for the wealthy or powerful. The rules must be enforced equally for everybody.

Recently, I met a retired judge from Africa who talked about his life and work. He was well renowned and highly respected. He sadly got mixed up in an extra-marital affair and on his way back from a place where he should not have been, he witnessed a murder taking place. He had too much to lose so he kept quiet. He was the judge at the trial but an innocent man was charged and because he could not provide an eye witness about his whereabouts on the night of the murder; the judge had no alternative but to find the innocent man guilty and sentence him to death.

He was deeply troubled and felt guilty. He asked for the man to be brought to his chambers and asked him if he had killed the man, could he provide proof of his whereabouts that night and when all that failed, he asked him if he had ever killed anyone and the man confessed to having killed 3 men in the past. The judge breathed a sigh of relief. "Well, at least he is a murderer, so he is not exactly innocent."

The judge said that he was meant to uphold the Law and whilst justice was an essential part of the Law, he had condemned an innocent man whilst the true murderer walked free. This unjust decision haunts him every day of his life. He asked for his story be told so that others do not face the same fate as he did for his misdeeds.

Martin Luther King Jr said that "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere." In the Old Testament, we see Ezekiel condemning the princes, priests, and officials for denying justice.

We also see Amos turn to religious leaders and plead for greater attention to justice: "Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." (Amos 5:23-24)

As Christians, we have a duty to be honest, confess our sins, uphold the Law, live decent and Godly lives, administer true justice and walk humbly with our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.



Revd Sue Shortman's Message:

I am looking forward to joining you all in the Lambeth circuit and getting to know the churches and her people. I will be hopefully moved into the Circuit by the time you are reading this and settling into life in the city. Something I am very much looking forward to. 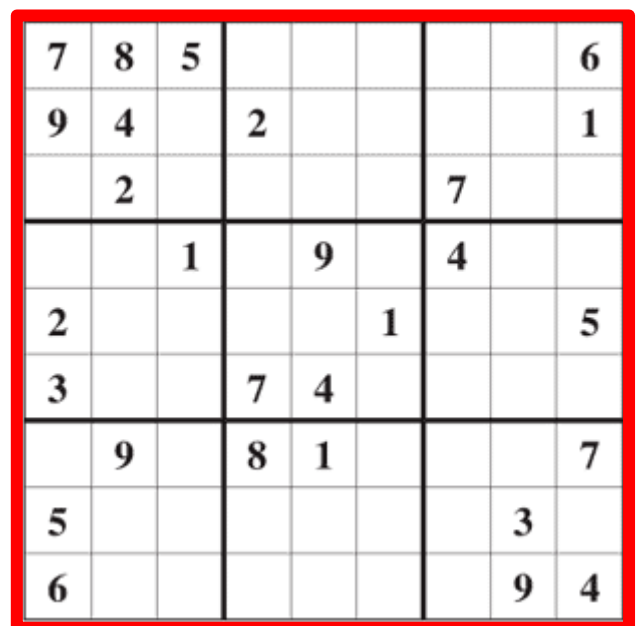

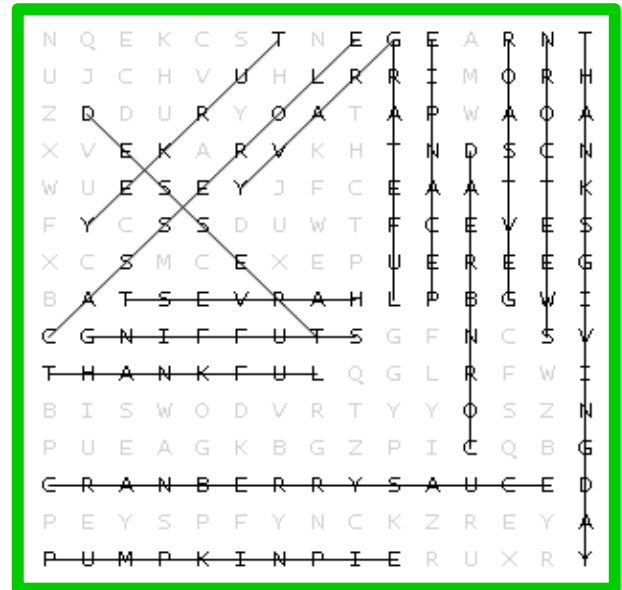
